## Launching of PRISM Webinars & Informational Videos

**The PRISM team is launching a series of webinars or informational videos on online learning and applications on Moodle.**

Bob Jackson, PRISM's K-12 Educational Liaison, will host the first several videos to launch the program. It is a desire of the PRISM team that we get member teachers to volunteer to do some webinars or informational videos on applications of Moodle. If you are a teacher that is using some of the activities like the lesson activity, the external tool, games and workshops, we would really like for you to share how you are using these through either a live webinar or informational video. You can also do a webinar or video on online pedagogy discussing your "tips and tricks" that you utilize in being an effective online instructor. You can also show how you effectively provide resources to your students through a hybrid course. If you do a recorded video, we will ask you to upload your video to YouTube and send us a link to post on the PRISM website. If you want to do a live webinar, we would like to ask that you use a Zoom meeting and provide us a date and time that you would like to do the meeting. We will then invite PRISM members to attend.

**Informational videos on Moodle applications and digital pedagogy are now available to view on the PRISM website.**

Most of these informational videos will be short, 15-20 minutes in length and contain content on digital pedagogy, course design and specific Moodle applications. The first informational video serves the purpose of introducing this program and Bob has a short discussion on course design and organization of content. The next two videos are on course authoring and mastery learning settings.

**An important component of this program will be for you to provide the PRISM team with feedback.**

After watching an informational video or webinar, please let us know if the information provided is beneficial, ask questions about the specific content, and suggest perhaps better or different ways of doing the same type of activity or instructional method. We would also like for you suggest topics that you would like to be covered in future informational videos.

### October Moodle Training Courses

We are offering six FREE online Moodle training courses this fall. We offer Professional Growth Plan (PGP) points for each course.

**Basic Moodle for Teachers** (10 PGP Points) – A basic introduction to the Moodle LMS. You will learn how to build a classroom course and populate it with files, assignments, and quizzes. Dates: 10/6 - 10/27

**Intermediate Moodle for Teachers** (10 PGP Points) – A continuation from the Basic Moodle for Teachers course. Choose this course if you already have Moodle experience and would like to learn how to use some of the more advanced features like wikis, databases, lessons, and RSS feeds. Dates: 10/7 - 10/28

**Advanced Moodle for Teachers** (10 PGP Points) – A continuation from the Intermediate Moodle for Teachers course. This course will take the Intermediate level course a step further as participants learn advanced grade book features, groups and groupings, conditional activities, and the workshop activity module. Dates: 10/8 - 10/29

**Crash Course Activities and Resources for Moodle** (8 PGP Points)

This course focuses on learning how to use the Moodle activities and resources to develop quality lessons for students on the online Moodle platform. Teachers will learn how to grade assignments and other activities more efficiently and provide feedback to students in a secure online environment.

**Crash Course on Gradebook & Grading for Moodle** (8 PGP Points)

This course focuses on learning how to use the Moodle grade book. Teachers will learn how to add, edit, and update grade items in addition to advanced grade book topics.

Dates: Ongoing - Register any time!

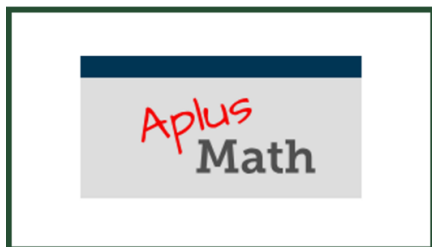
**Crash Course on Quiz Question Types for Moodle** (8 PGP Points)

Aplus Math has interactive math resources for teachers, parents, and students. Resources include worksheets, math games, math flashcards and homework help. Teachers can design customized tests to use with their classes. Questions can be authored or chosen from a library of existing question banks. Teachers even have the freedom to select the answer choices, provide the explanations, and incorporate images, passages, and instructions. Teachers can check student progress on assigned work and are provided with comprehensive statistics and graphical data displaying student performance on assessments.

BioEd Online uses state-of-the-art technology to provide instant access to reliable, cutting-edge information and the tools of biology and the life sciences. Resources available include streaming video presentations narrated by educational leaders in life science areas, slides that can be downloaded and integrated into slideshow presentations (references are provided for each), free inquiry-based, hands-on activities, worksheets, storybooks, in-depth articles and comprehensive worksheets. There is also a current news page available with from a variety of sources, including Nature News and Baylor College of Medicine. Covering a wide range of basic science topics, from genetics to zoology, biological inventions and climate change, news items provided here can serve as "starters" for class discussion, the basis for new lessons, or resources to enhance curricular activities.
