Crash Course on Moodle - Quiz Question Types

Crash Course on Moodle - Quiz Question Types is a distance education course designed to provide teachers the skills necessary to use a basic Moodle course to:

- Learn to create different types of questions within tests and quizzes these include: true/false, multiple choice, short answer, essay, Cloze, drag and drop into images and text, questions with calculations required within them and others.
- 2. Learn to develop high-level assessments with a variety of question types.
- 3. Learn to develop assessments that have good feedback to students upon completion.

Quiz Question Types Include:

- True/False
- Multiple Choice
- Matching
- Cloze Questions
- Select Missing Words
- Short Answer
- Essay
- Drag & Drop onto an Image
- Drag & Drop into Text
- Drag & Drop Markers
- Numerical Answers
- Calculations using Wildcards
- Calculated Simple using Wildcards

Special Note: Crash Course on Moodle - Quiz Question Types is meant to be an introduction to the Moodle LMS and some basic tools and resources that can be utilized on LMS platform. By taking this course, a teacher or administrator should obtain the skills to setup a basic Moodle course to provide a platform of resources to students or other course participants. It is not a comprehensive training for Moodle. Many aspects and features of the Moodle LMS will not be covered in this course. Registration for Course

Crash Course on Gradebook & Grading in Moodle

Crash Course on Gradebook & Grading for Moodle is a distance education course designed to provide teachers the skills necessary to:

- 1. Setup a gradebook within a Moodle course.
- 2. Learn to edit and make changes within a gradebook on Moodle.
- 3. Learn to manually add graded items (i.e.: assignments, labs, projects, term paper grades, quizzes, tests, etc.) into the gradebook of a given course.
- 4. Learn to manually add grades to the gradebook.
- 5. Learn to export / print gradebook pages

Special Note: Crash Course on Gradebook & Grading for Moodle is meant to be an introduction to the Moodle LMS and these features. By taking this course, a teacher or administrator should obtain the skills to begin effectively using the gradebook within a given course. It is **not** a comprehensive training for Moodle. If you want more comprehensive training, please register for one of the following PRISM distance education courses:

Basic Moodle for Teachers
Intermediate Moodle for Teachers
Advanced Moodle for Teachers

These are 5 week courses offered on a monthly basis.

Digital Content Workshop Tour







The Office of eLearning, with the help of the Rockstars of Curation, will travel the state to offer Digital Content Curation Workshops throughout the 2017-2018 school year. These workshops are intended to support districts and teachers who are journeying down the digital learning path. Districts are encouraged to send a team of teachers (up to 5) to learn about the process of digital content curation and best practices. The morning will focus on professional learning, and the afternoon will be a work time, with support, so teacher teams can collaborate and leave with curated digital materials. We suggest sending a grade level team or content area team of teachers. Attendees will be asked to vet and curate digital materials to use in their classrooms, but also to share with colleagues across the state via Amazon Inspire. Our goal is to grow this network of teachers and encour-

age collaboration within districts and across the state. While the work of curating digital content is on-going, working together makes the load lighter.

The Office of eLearning will reimburse districts for attendee substitute teacher costs.
